## CLASS 21—POTTED PLANTS

- Plants are to have been grown by the exhibitor for at least 3 months prior to the show
- No oiling or artificial shine is permitted
- Where necessary, staking is permitted, but should not be obtrusive

Prize money: 1st—\$4, 2nd—\$3, 3rd—\$2

1. African Violet, single crown, any colour
2. Begonia, any type, in bloom
3. Cactus or Succulent, can be multiple plants (e.g. Hens \& Chickens)
4. Cactus and Succulent Garden
5. Coleus, one plant
6. Potted Herb, one variety, can be multiple plants
7. Potted Herb Garden, at least 3 herbs grown in a container
8. Orchid, in bloom
9. Ivy, any variety
10. Potted Geranium, any type
11. Fairy Garden, miniature plants, may include accessories, not to exceed 18 " ( 46 cm ) in any direction
12. Best potted plant in bloom, not already listed, named if possible
13. Best potted foliage plant, not already listed, named if possible

## CLASS 22—SUNFLOWERS

- Sunflowers can be shown as a stalk cut at the ground, or it is optional to trim the root ball and water the root. Wrap and tie a plastic bag around the root ball.

Prize money: 1st—\$8, 2nd—\$7, 3rd—\$6, 4th—\$5, 5th—\$4

1. Tallest sunflower stalk (does not need to be in bloom)

## CLASS 23-CUT FLOWERS

- Cut flowers should be exhibited with a small amount of own attached foliage.
- All specimens, fresh or dried, must be grown by the exhibitor.
- Hint: cedar is allowed to hold stems in place. Ensure the cedar does not show above the rim of the container.
- Hint: use pebbles or aquarium gravel to weigh down a container to make it more stable and prevent it from tipping over.
- A bloom is an individual flower. Note: A bud showing colour is counted as a bloom.

Prize money: 1st-\$3, 2na-\$2, 3rd—\$1 (unless otherwise specified)

1. Aster, 3 to 5 blooms, any colour
2. Calendula, 3 to 5 blooms, any colour
3. Cosmos, 3 to 5 blooms, any colours, not to exceed 12 " $(31 \mathrm{~cm})$ above the container rim
4. Dahlia, 3 to 5 blooms, stems showing foliage, any cultivar/colour(s), named if possible
5. Echinacea (Coneflower), 3 to 5 blooms, any colour
6. Geranium, 1 stem (foliage does not need to be attached)
7. Gladiolus, 1 spike

8. Gladiolus, 3 spikes, one colour

9. Herbs, 3 to 5 varieties, 3 stems of each, named and displayed in water
10. Hosta, 3 leaves, one cultivar
11. Hosta, 6 leaves, 3 different cultivars
12. Hydrangea, 2 stems, not to exceed $12^{\prime \prime}(31 \mathrm{~cm})$ above the container rim
13. Marigold, 5 blooms, under 2", one colour
14. Marigold, 5 blooms, over $2^{\prime \prime}$ and under 3 ", one colour
15. Marigold, 3 blooms, over 3 ", one colour
16. Nasturtium, 3 to 5 blooms, any colour
17. Ornamental Grass, 3 stems of same cultivar, named if possible, stem length not to exceed 18 " ( 46 cm )
18. Petunia, 3 stems, any variety or colour
19. Rose, 1 spray or bloom, any cultivar except miniature, named if possible
20. Rose, miniature, 1 bloom or spray
21. Rudbeckia (Black-Eyed Susan), 3 to 5 blooms
22. Rudbeckia (NOT Black-Eyed Susan), 3 to 5 blooms, not to exceed 12 " $(31 \mathrm{~cm})$ above container rim
23. Sedum, 3 stems
24. Snapdragon, 3 to 5 spikes/stems, any colour
25. Sunflower, 1 bloom, not to exceed 8 " $(21 \mathrm{~cm})$ center, stem length not to exceed $12^{\prime \prime}(31 \mathrm{~cm})$ above container rim
26. Zinnia, 3 to 5 blooms, any cultivar, any colour
27. Annual, one variety not already listed, 3 to 5 stems/stalks, named if possible
28. Perennial, one variety not already listed, 3 to 5 stems/stalks, named if possible

## Sections 29 to 36:

- These sections are bouquets displayed in a container of water
- All flowers, herbs and grasses; fresh or dried, must be grown by the exhibitor
- Specimens can be the same or a mix of any colour(s)/variety or cultivar within their respective section
- Except for Section \#29 Gladiolus, entries not to exceed 20 " in width and 15 " above the rim of the container

Prize money: 1st-\$5, 2nd—\$3, 3rd— $\$ 2$

29. Gladiolus, collection, any colour(s)/ varieties, 5 to 9 spikes

30. Cosmos bouquet
31. Sunflowers bouquet
32. Bouquet of mixed Ornamental grasses, foliage and/or herbs
33. Marigolds bouquet
34. Asters bouquet
35. Petunias bouquet
36. Bouquet of mixed Annual and/or Perennial flowers. To contain a minimum of 5 different kinds or cultivars, shown in 1 container. Some ornamental grasses and/or herbs can be added as fillers.

## CLASS 24—FLORAL DESIGN, FLOWER SPECIALS



- The exhibitor must have arranged all designs
- Material for the Design Classes may be obtained from any source (fresh plant materials may be purchased)
- Purchased accessories such as fruit, vegetables, grasses, herbs, ornaments, ribbons, stones, etc., are allowed in the Design Class
- Dried plant materials and decorative wood are permitted but no artificial flowers or soil are allowed unless specifically called for
* Entries not to exceed 20 " in width

1. Storybook Goats-in keeping with this year's theme of the Fair, an arrangement of fresh flowers
2. Lonesome Beauty-an arrangement of assorted types of leaves w ith one single flower-accessories may be used
3. Seashells by the Seashore—a miniature design—max. dimensions 5 " or 12.5 cm in any direction
4. Goats in the Meadow-an arrangement of colourful plant materials found along the roadside or in a field
5. Hats off to Middleville Fair-a decorated hat
6. Childhood Days-a design of fresh plant material
7. Country Kitchen-a hanging arrangement including any or all of these suggestions: dried herbs, fruit, vegetables, flowers, seasonings, spices, etc.

NOTE: Upon completion of judging all entries, the Judge will choose
the 2 following awards:

1. Judge's Favourite
2. Best In Show
