CLASS 17—ROOTS and VEGETABLES

NOTE:

- All produce must be grown by the exhibitor
- Produce should be MEDIUM size and REGULAR shape unless otherwise stated
- Produce should be free of blemishes, and carefully brushed but not washed or polished
- Root and vegetable stems to be attached and trimmed to 1" unless otherwise stated
- Roots to be neatly trimmed unless otherwise stated
- Display plates or containers must be firm for support
- Firmly attach entry tags with tape or string to display

Prize money:

1st—\$4, 2ND—\$3, 3RD—\$2

- 1. Beans, 5 green, calyx, tip and portion of stem attached
- 2. Beans, 5 yellow, calyx, tip and portion of stem attached
- 3. Beets, 3
- 4. Cabbage, 1 green
- 5. Cabbage, 1 red
- 6. Carrots, 5
- 7. Corn, 3 ears of Sweet, partially husked, silk removed
- 8. Cucumbers, 3 ripe yellow, 6" & over
- 9. Cucumbers, 3 table size, 6" & over
- 10. Cucumbers, 5 Pickling, not over 4"
- 11. Eggplant, 1
- 12. Garlic bulbs (3), roots trimmed to $\frac{1}{4}$ ", stems to $\frac{1}{2}$ "
- 13. Leeks, 3, tops trimmed 4-6" above white shank
- 14. Onions, 3 from Dutch Sets, outer skin & dirt removed but not peeled
- 15. Onions, 3 red, roots removed
- 16. Onions, 3 Spanish, roots removed
- 17. Parsnips, 3
- 18. Peppers, 3 green, trim stems to 1/2"
- 19. Peppers, 3 hot, stem trimmed to 1/2"
- 20. Potatoes, 3 red, named, in a basket
- 21. Potatoes, 3 white, named, in a basket
- 22. Pumpkin, 1 field, short stem intact
- 23. Pumpkin, 1 pie, short stem intact
- 24. Squash, 1 acorn
- 25. Squash, 1 butternut
- 26. Tomatoes, 10 cherry, any variety, must be under 2" dia, does not need to be attached to a truss
- 27. Tomatoes, 3 green paste or regular, calyx attached
- 28. Tomatoes, 3 ripe paste, calyx attached
- 29. Tomatoes, 3 ripe regular, calyx attached
- 30. Tomatoes, collection, 2 each, minimum 3 varieties with maximum 2 each of 5 varieties
- 31. Turnips (Rutabagas) ,1 Swede
- 32. Zucchini, 1 Yellow or Green, no longer than 8" in length

CLASS 18—FRUITS

NOTES:

- Plates or containers must be strong enough to support entry.
- Firmly attach entry tags with tape or string to display

1. Apples, 3 named, stems attached, not cleaned or polished

- 2. Apples, 2 qt. (2 litre) basket of crab
- 3. Citron, 1
- 4. Muskmelon (Cantaloupe), 1

- 6. Watermelon, 1

CLASS 19-ROOT, VEGETABLE & FRUIT SPECIALS

Prize money: 1st—\$4, 2nd - \$3, 3rd—\$2 (unless otherwise specified)

- 1. Garlic, 1 braid (minimum 12 bulbs)
- 2. Potato, heaviest, 1
- 3. Gourds, 5, mixed ornamental on a plate
- 4. Tomato, heaviest, 1
- 5. Vegetable oddity, 1
- 6. Best collection of Garden Produce grown by Exhibitor, with at least 8 (min) to 10 (max) named varieties,
- 2 specimens each. Herbs may be used as decoration but do not count as a vegetable. Decorate for Fair Theme "Goats!". Arrangement and quality to count.
- Best collection of <u>Organic Garden Produce</u> grown by Exhibitor, with 6 named varieties, 2 specimens each. Herbs may be used as decoration but do not count as a vegetable. Decorate for Fair Theme "Goats". Arrangement and quality to count.

Note: Organic garden produce includes only those grown without the use of synthetics (i.e. chemical fertilizers, insecticides or herbicides).
